*BioTropical Institute offers various scholarships exclusively for its students. All of them aim to promote training and knowledge, and the exchange of experiences among young people and professionals from all continents. For this reason, the scholarships facilitate all kinds of activities in the Arctic Circle, Africa, Amazon, Galapagos, Asia, Australia, USA and Europe.

With the scholarship you choose you can take a course and even a diploma in the place you want, totally free. In addition, during the course, you will have accommodation, transfers, excursions and activities, as well as free admission to rescue centers, nature schools, interpretation centers and others that may be part of it.

The duration of the scholarships ranges from 3 to 13 days depending on the course you take and you can also, if you request it in advance, you can add a volunteering program from 10 days to more than one month in different countries, some of them with accommodation included. Each participant receives on average a contribution of 2000 to 3000 euros in services, training, activities, transfers and accommodation.
